some suitability criteria for naturism?

You may find these criteria helpful when seeking an appropriate outdoor space

1. have sunlight, with perhaps possible shade from trees
2. be in an area not heavily frequented by a lot of members of the public (who may therefore perhaps object)
3. possibly be a grassy glade area within a patch of trees or shrubs, *provided* that this is unlikely to also shelter unwelcome sexual activity
4. have a reasonably level surface which would be comfortable to lie on
5. be accessible on foot (whilst carrying sunbathing paraphernalia)
6. **not** to be publicly associated with unacceptable sexual activity
7. a period of the day, e.g. before or after other users of the space, perhaps weekdays rather than week-ends, may be more appropriate

ALSO

- A. perhaps be near to water for cooling off or swimming
- B. ideally not far from toilet facilities

Ownership of the land, and any associated legal restrictions on uses, should also be taken into account.
